Major Program B. Music: Performance emphasis - Vocal

Briefly describe how Information Literacy will be taught within your major program. List courses in which these skills will be embedded.

The competencies of Information Literacy for Music students will be taught in connection with prose writing assignments in Music History courses, particularly MUSI 210W, 211W, 212W, 213W, 214W, and 215W; and in connection with performance preparation in Applied courses, particularly MUSI 122 and 222; and MUSI 101 which implements the Music Department's performance requirement for all students. Additionally, students in this degree program undergo further critical study of information in connection with Vocal Literature courses, MUSI 225, 226, 227, 228; and with performance preparation for Senior Recital, Music 297, and in its prerequisite half-recital.

Are all these courses required of your students? If not, how will you assure that all students attain the exit expectations for Information Literacy.

One course, chosen from MUSI 210W, 211W, 212W, 213W, 214W, and 215W, is required of all Music students. Three other Music History courses, MUSI 284, 285, and 286, are required of all Music students. MUSI 122 and 101 are required of all Music students. Additionally, two courses chosen from MUSI 225, 226, 227, and 228, and MUSI 222 and MUSI 297, are required of all students in this degree program.
