Major Program Nursing

Nursing Research, NURS 213W, will include electronic literature searches with databases relevant for nursing (i.e. CINAHL, PubMed); electronic and manual retrieval of published research; synthesis and evaluation of multiple research manuscripts; and discussion of ways to apply the findings to enhance nursing practice.

Public Health, NURS 270, will include accessing, comprehending, and conducting secondary analysis with electronic state or federal public health databases, and drawing accurate conclusions from the analysis for populations needs assessment.

Nursing Science for the Adult, NURS 218 or 219, will include searching the internet for accurate health education resources relevant for consumer education, and evaluating web sites.

Capstone Practicum, NURS 289 will include a literature search and creation of an electronic presentation teaching healthcare colleagues about evidence based practice (e.g. practice based guidelines).
