- I. Information Literacy Report (See 'DL IL task force prelim report')
 - T. Scheinfeldt presented the task force report. He emphasized that the task force feels
 Information Literacy is critically important to UConn students. The university administration now
 needs to decide if it is critically important to the UConn curriculum. If so, then the task force
 suggested three possible ways of manifesting this. If it is not critically important, then a fourth
 option is just to remove the literacy.
 - M. Wagner asked members for their feedback since she will be taking this to the Senate Executive Committee.
 - One member did not like Option 2 piggybacking Info Lit onto W, Q or EL courses but was in favor of either of the other two options.

- Another member felt like Option 2 was actually a good option; "It's ugly, but it does disperse the pain."
- All of the options have problems, such as potentially adding credits or adding a level of complexity in the implementation.
- There was discussion of the extent to which Information Literacy is discipline-specific.
- One member felt there was a sort of moral element to this, that we are teaching students to use these skills in good faith.
- One member asked if the committee considered options that might put Info Lit under the FYE
 model. We always jump to the need for a three-credit class, but can the Info Lit objectives be
 accomplish with fewer credits?
- In general, we want to be sure that whatever we do is meaningful and enforceable.
- One member felt that data security needed to be on the list of topics covered under Info Lit.
- We will send an additional call for feedback, so feel free to continue to comment.
- The Information Literacy subcommittee needs another co-chair. Brenda Brueggemann and Anke Finger were suggested as potential candidates.

 - The subcommittee has reached an impasse, and the co-chairs are seeking the full GEOC committee's feedback.
 - CA1 Members seemed to have differing opinions about what it meant to be a humanities course. Some members felt the NURS course was more clinical-based or social science-based.
 - One GEOC member suggested sending the course to CA2 to see if they feel it fits those criteria. Does the course take an epistemological approach that is more CA1 or more CA2?
 - One member felt that the answer to that question was probably in what texts the course uses.
 - One member wondered what CLAS category the course is. It is "E World Cultures."
 - One member felt that there would be no harm in engaging with the proposer.
 - A couple members felt that the issue some reviewers had with the course appeared to be more
 with its position than its content. There is sometimes a belief that some departments or
 disciplines cannot teach certain content areas, and some members felt that was happening here.
 - One member did not think we should have CA2 review it. Either it is CA1 or it is not.
 - In general, committee members wanted more time to consider the course before deciding whether or not it aligned. Feedback over email will be requested.
